Bible Readings

Psalm 23

The Lord is my shepherd I shall not want He makes me lie down in green pastures He leads me beside still waters He restores my soul He leads me n right places For his names sake Even though I walk through the darkest valley I fear no evil For your rod and your staff-they comfort me You prepare a table before me In the presence of my enemies You anoint my head with oil My cup overflows Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me All the days of my life And I shall dwell in the house of the Lord My whole life long.

1John 3:16-24

This is how we know what love is: Christ gave his life for us. We too, then, ought to give our lives for our brothers! If a rich person sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against his brother, how can he claim that he loves God? My children, our love should not be just words and talk; it must be true love, which shows itself in action.

This, then, is how we will know that we belong to the truth; this is how we will be confident in God's presence. If our conscience condemns us, we know that God is greater than our conscience and that he knows everything. And so my dear friends, if our conscience does not condemn us, we have courage in God's presence. We receive from him whatever we ask because we obey his commands and do what pleases him. What he commands is that we believe in his son Jesus Christ and love one another just as Christ commanded us. Whoever obeys God's commands lives in union with God

and God lives in union with him. And because of the Spirit that God has given us we know that God lives in union with us.

John 10: 7, 8 and 11-15

So Jesus said again, "I am telling you the truth: I am the gate for the sheep. All others who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them.

I am the good shepherd, who is willing to die for the sheep. When the hired man who is not a shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees a wolf coming, he leaves the sheep and runs away, so the wolf snatches the sheep and scatters them. The hired man runs away because he is only a hired man and does not care about the sheep. I am the good shepherd. As the Father knows me and I know the Father, in the same way I know my sheep and they know me. And I am willing to die for them".

Reflection I am the Good Shepherd.

On his journeys from town to town Jesus would have observed many shepherds with their flocks. Looking after sheep was very different in Jesus day than it is today. In Jesus's days the shepherd walked in front of the flock and they would follow. Today sheep are driven using dogs and land-rover's and kept enclosed in fields.

What do we know about sheep? There are over twelve references to sheep and shepherds in the bible. They are largely defenseless, easily frightened, and follow each other. They can also be difficult to handle. I have been following Matt Baker on TV where He changed the makeup of his shepherd mother's flock after she had an accident while attending her sheep. She wanted to continue as a shepherd but couldn't manage her very large sheep. The solution was to sell the large sheep and replace them with smaller sheep that are easier to manage. Sheep can also be extremely stubborn as I know from experience. While looking after my daughters horses on the Pennines there were also two sheep who were allowed to roam anywhere on the farm. While I was out they jumped over the gate onto the road in front of a car. Fortunately not causing an accident. On my return a friend said that the sheep ought not to be left free or they could cause an accident. I had a convenient enclosure that I could use so I went to find the sheep. I put a lead on the sheep and expected to lead it to the Enclosure.

'Foolish boy' the sheep had no intention of coming and would have been strangled by the lead first. I finished half carrying and dragging it, gaining a hernia for my effort.

During WW1 a shepherd out with his sheep was stopped by soldiers out looking for food for their regiment. They confiscated the sheep. This deprived the shepherd of his lively hood and treasured sheep. When the soldiers and sheep were far off the shepherd called to his sheep. They immediately turned and ran back to their shepherd leaving the soldiers helplessly trying to stop them.

Sheep need and rely on their shepherd. Jesus said" I am the good shepherd willing to die for my sheep."

When some cattle needed to cross a river that was infested with Piranha a cow was sacrificed up stream which drew the piranha, allowing the herd to cross safely.

The difference is that Jesus died willingly for us to restore us to God. Jesus will lead if we will follow.

The Lord is my shepherd.
